UFA Website Privacy Commitment

At United Farmers of Alberta Co-operative Limited and our subsidiaries (collectively "UFA"), we are committed to maintaining the accuracy, confidentiality and security of your personal information. UFA has adopted a Privacy Policy, supported by a series of Privacy Commitments in order to address the specific privacy concerns of certain groupings of individuals.

We have developed this *UFA Website Privacy Commitment* to describe our privacy policies and practices and how we collect, use and disclose the personal information of those individuals who visit our websites. We have developed other documents that describe our privacy policies and practices with respect to our employees and with respect to our customers, suppliers and other parties with whom we interact. Privacy Commitment Effective for Canada

It is UFA's policy to comply with the privacy legislation within each jurisdiction in which we operate. Sometimes the privacy legislation and / or an individual's right to privacy are different from one jurisdiction to another. This Privacy Commitment covers only those activities that are subject to the provisions of Canada's federal and provincial privacy laws, as applicable.

This Privacy Commitment has a limited scope and application. Consequently, the rights and obligations contained in this Privacy Commitment may not be available to all individuals or in all jurisdictions. If you are unsure if or how this Privacy Commitment applies to you, please contact our Privacy Officer for more information.

What is Personal Information?

For the purposes of this Privacy Commitment, personal information is any information about an identifiable individual, other than the person's business title or business contact information when used or disclosed for the purpose of business communications.

What Personal Information Do We Collect?

You can visit our websites without telling us who you are or revealing any information about yourself, including your e-mail address. Our web servers may collect information related to your visit to our websites, including the IP address and domain used to access our websites, the type and version of your browser, the website you came from to access our websites, the page you entered and exited at, any website page that is viewed by that IP address and what country you are from. We use this information to monitor our websites' performance (such as number of visits, average time spent, page views) and for our business purposes such as working to continually upgrade our website

In addition, we collect the personal information that you submit to our website, such as your name, address and any other contact or other information that you choose to provide by:

- using the "contact us" portion of this website;
- applying for a position with UFA through this website;
- by corresponding with a representative of UFA via e-mail using the hyperlinks created for that purpose;
- when registering through myUFA; or
- when shopping online at UFA through ufa.com.

Where you request information from us, we may use the e-mail address that you provide to send you information about offers on products and services that we believe may be of interest to you.

If you have requested or consented to being added to an e-mail mailing list to provide you with certain information on a regular basis, or if we send you information about our offers on products and services by e-mail, you may ask us to remove you from the list at any time (using the unsubscribe instructions provided with each e-mail and on the site where you signed up).

How Do We Use Cookies?

When you visit our websites, we may place a "cookie" on the hard drive of your computer to track your visit. A cookie is a small data file that is transferred to your hard drive through your web browser that can only be read by the website that placed the cookie on your hard drive. The cookie acts as an identification card and allows our websites to identify you and to record your passwords and preferences. The cookie allows us to track your visit to the websites so that we can better understand your use of our websites so that we can customize and tailor the websites to better meet your needs.

Most web browsers are set to accept cookies. However, on most web browsers you may change this setting to have your web browser either: (1) notify you prior to a website placing a cookie on your hard drive so that you can decide whether or not to accept the cookie; or (2) automatically prevent the placing of a cookie on your hard drive. It should be noted that if cookies are not accepted, you will not be able to access a number of web pages found on the website.

Google Analytics

Our websites may use Google Analytics, a web analytics service provided by Google, Inc. ("Google"). The information generated by the cookie about your use of our website (including your IP address) will be transmitted to and stored by Google on servers in the United States. Google will use this information for the purpose of evaluating your use of our website, compiling reports on website activity for website operators and providing other services relating to website activity and internet usage. Google may also transfer this information to third parties where required to do so by law, or where such third parties process the information on Google's behalf. Google will not associate your IP address with any other data held by Google. Further information about Google's privacy policy may be obtained from http://www.google.com/privacy.html.

Hotjar

In addition, our websites may use Hotjar in order to better understand our users' needs and to optimize our website services and experiences. Hotjar is a technology service that helps us better understand our users' experience (e.g. how much time they spend on which pages, which links they choose to click, what users do and don't like, etc.) and this enables us to build and maintain our service with user feedback. Hotjar uses cookies and other technologies to collect data on our users' behavior and their devices. This includes a device's IP address (processed during your session and stored in a de-identified form), device screen size, device type (unique device identifiers), browser information, geographic location (country only), and the preferred language used to display our website. Hotjar stores this information on our behalf in a pseudonymized user profile.
