4. First-Aid Measures

Description of first aid measures

General advice:

First aid personnel should pay attention to their own safety. If the patient is likely to become unconscious, place and transport in stable sideways position (recovery position). Immediately remove contaminated clothing.

If inhaled:

Keep patient calm, remove to fresh air, seek medical attention. If not breathing, give artificial respiration.

If on skin:

Immediately wash thoroughly with soap and water, seek medical attention. Wash contaminated clothing before reuse.

If in eyes:

Remove contact lenses, if present. Wash affected eyes for at least 15 minutes under running water with eyelids held open. Seek medical attention.

If swallowed:

Do not give solids or liquids. Do not induce vomiting due to aspiration hazard. Never induce vomiting or give anything by mouth if the victim is unconscious or having convulsions.

Methods and material for containment and cleaning up
